

II-E Nature and Culture (ii) Culture

Along with deepening the understanding of traditional and regional cultures, a diverse range of contemporary culture is absorbed and many opportunities are provided to the prefectural residents. This is the ideal for the culture that Chiba strives to achieve, and the prefecture is actively taking steps to this end. Music and drama performances are staged in such cultural facilities as the Chiba Prefectural Culture Hall, the Aobanomori Arts and Culture Hall, and the Sawayaka Chiba People's Plaza, providing a base where people may participate in regional cultural activities. In addition, Chiba Prefecture has been promoting a museum network concept since the mid-1960s, and currently there are 10 prefectural museums and art. With the Chuo Museum as the focal point, cooperation is being promoted through the exchange of information and materials as well as shared usage. The same type of networking is also being attempted with libraries.

II-F Living (i) Education

Chiba Prefecture has established the “Long Term Vision for Education -Dream・Future 2025”, by which educational curricula are taught. In this, an environment is being created in which people from early childhood are provided with the opportunities to develop the grounding to become familiar with foreign peoples and cultures through cultural exchanges. In practice, the prefecture is promoting the “Chiba Internal Education Plan” (CIEP) among elementary, middle, and high schools, which fosters people that can play active roles using language in an international environment, as well as holding internationalization seminars for high school students (interchanges with foreign students studying in Japan and provision of ALT's; Assistant Language Teachers, into local schools).

Chiba Prefecture has created a health services system that can cater to such elementary needs as health care for mothers and children, and specialized care (such as for AIDS), to meet the needs of its residents. In addition to maintaining disaster response hospitals, a prenatal care system, and prefectural hospitals; specialized medical facilities for cancer, emergencies, psychiatric, pediatric, circulatory, and rehabilitation care have also been established. Several other systems and facilities also exist to ensure that elderly and disabled people can enjoy full and healthy lives.

**II-F Living
(iv) Housing**

As the population of Chiba Prefecture reached 6 million in the year 2002, the number of people per household decreased to 2.6 in 2005, and the number of childless couples and single-parent households is said to increase from herein. In Chiba Prefecture, due to the trend towards return to the city, the supply of new houses and proportion of used housing are declining, but the number of housing units significantly exceeds the number of households, resulting in a substantial number of unoccupied houses in the prefecture. Based on this reality, a "Chiba Prefecture Housing Master Plan" has been prepared to deal with issues related to improving the quality of the housing stock that can cater to the aging society, and to create comfortable housing and residential town areas, giving consideration to the environment, and to form a residential environment which is attractive. In this plan, environmental issues, energy saving measures, minimization of resource consumption measures, and plans for recycling in housing are being promoted, as well as construction of houses that are environmentally-friendly. To utilize the special regional features that Chiba Prefecture offers, areas such as Chiba New Town and Makuhari New City show that efforts are being made to establish a living environment that is linked with urban planning. Further, to answer the needs of internationalization, measures for provision of housing information to visiting students and foreigners, as well as support in securing living accommodations, are being examined.

II-F Living (v) Measures for Environmental Issues

The prefecture has endeavored to realize four philosophies -establishment of a circular society, coexistence with nature, contribution to the preservation of the global environment, and steps for all prefectural residents to participate (with the basic aim of preservation of a healthy and rich environment, and passing this onto future generations). Residents, businesses, and the prefecture's municipalities hold a common awareness and mutual objectives, and are taking steps to minimize the production of waste and promote recycling; such as in the "Chiba 21 Zero Garbage Plan" (March, 2000), and in July 1998 a policy against dioxins was established as a measure against the production of dioxins in garbage incineration. For this purpose, together with the people of the prefecture, NPOs and NGOs, businesses, the prefecture, cities and towns share the same recognition and objectives and have embarked on a mission to change from a "mass-consumption" society to a "circular" society.
